- Thriving doesn't always like thriving. Our lives can look barren from the outside, but be thriving on the inside. We can have joy, peace, and fulfillment despite our circumstances.
- The reason many of us struggle to fully trust God is that we don't really know Him through personal experience. We don't really "yada" Him.
- As we turn from our ways and trust fully in God, get to know Him through His Word, and gather in life-giving community, we will naturally bear good fruit.
- We all want the abundant life Jesus promised, but many of us are going about it the wrong way— by striving, not abiding. Instead of striving to bear good fruit, we should strive to know the Lord and the fruit will naturally follow.
- Fear of the Lord does not mean to be afraid (in terror) of Him. It means to reverence and live in awe of the Lord— humbly worshiping and submitting our lives to Him.
- Fruit is not for the tree— it's for everyone else. When our lives bear good fruit, others get to "taste and see that the Lord is good" (Psalm 34:8).
- The primary way God speaks is through His Word. If we want to live abiding and obedient lives, we need to be in His Word— we need to read it for ourselves and get to know God through it.
- To move from striving to abiding, we need to learn to turn from relying on ourselves and trust fully in God's ways and wisdom, inviting Him into every area of our lives.
- God entrusts us with our children, and He will guide us with wisdom as we look to Him.
- As Christ-followers, we carry the Holy Spirit into every place we go.
- Good works are meant to be the fruit of our relationship with God— not the root of it.
